Statement of Mission

Singles Ministry exists to provide a ministry of encouragement, support and nurture for single adults within the church.

It seeks to achieve its mission through:

WORSHIP

Providing spiritual events where single adults can meet, associate and worship together in an atmosphere that recognizes and affirms Christian values

GROWTH

Conducting a variety of events that provide for the social and fellowship needs of single adults

AFFIRMATION

Offering acceptance and support for single adults experiencing loneliness and loss, and affirming them in their search for purpose and significance

COMMUNITY

Providing a community in which the unique concerns of single adults can be heard, shared and addressed

SERVICE

Developing meaningful service opportunities and outreach activities for single adults within the Church and the community

RESOURCES

Developing appropriate resources for strengthening ministry to single adults.

Leadership

Singles Ministries Coordinators need to be:

1. People of Integrity: Authentic leaders are characterized by their relationships. Openness and honesty are vital to authentic leadership.

2. Affirming and Positive: Pleasant, positive leaders achieve more than those who are negative. No one's life circumstances are perfect. It is important to focus on affirmation, appreciation and encouragement.

3. Observant and Discerning: It is important to look out for the indicators of what makes Singles Ministry effective and successful.

4. Able to Maintain Personal Boundaries: Over-commitment often causes distress to leaders so it is essential that leaders nurture themselves and plan time out for self-care. All leaders have personal limits to their time, money and energy. Managing these resources is imperative for sound leadership.

5. Able to Dream, Act and Evaluate: Strong leaders dream and plan boldly; they combine this with reflection, prayer and careful planning. Thorough preparation and enthusiastic implementation results in successful leadership.

6. Able to Manage Challenges: Balancing nurture and support in a caring and loving manner will enhance and enrich leadership to adult singles.

Responsibilities

The responsibilities of a Singles Coordinator include:

1. Form a Committee

Find responsive people who will help plan and develop activities and events specifically for single adults. Invite them to assist in making your ministry relevant and alive to the needs of the singles in your church.

2. Involve Singles in the Ministry of the Church

Find as many ways as possible to include the singles in all the various ministries of the church including worship, ministry to the community, and caring for the functional aspects of church life.

3. Plan 'Entry' Events

Assist the church in providing events that will help build bridges to singles and attract new adult single members, encourage them to be involved in the life of the church, and nurture their faith and investment in all of life's experiences.

4. Build Positive Attitudes

Help the congregation and church leaders develop a non-judgmental, open and accepting attitude towards singles and we minister to them in all situations in which they are found.
