

GUIDELINES AND SUGGESTIONS FOR  
GLOBAL MISSION  
IN THE LOCAL CONFERENCE

1. Global Mission should be part of the local Conference Strategic Plan for entering new areas and people groups. It focuses in placing an Adventist presence in un-entered areas and people groups as part of a 2-5 year plan with the goal of establishing an ongoing presence.
2. A description of the project and a budget should be submitted to the Conference Global Mission Coordinator, [by the end of August, requesting GM funding](#) and approval for the project in the following year. This is to give the Conference time to process the application prior to the closing date for the AUC which is the end of September.
3. Once approval has been received (usually by December), the GC/SPD and Union share of funds will be remitted to Conference
4. Direct Action plans should then be implemented, and progress reports sent to the Conference GM Coordinator. This should include the name and photo of the GM Pioneer, statistics of interests and baptisms, and photos of church buildings erected or baptisms held.
5. Global Mission pioneers should be carefully selected and properly trained.

A Global Mission project is usually limited to 2 or three years, with the ultimate goal of establishing a self-supporting church in the new area.
