WATCH

Watch *UNANIMOUS* with your small group. Allow participants opportunity to share their thoughts on images or points that particularly stood out, things that intrigued or raised questions for them.



READ

Read 2 Timothy 3:16-17 and 1 Corinthians 15:3-8 out loud with your group. Allow time to consider the texts and reflect on the case presented in the film.



DISCUSS

1. A 2000-year-old fragment of John's Gospel records Jesus' trial before Pilate. Jesus declares he has come to reveal truth. The Roman Governor asks, "What is truth?" In today's world, many ask the same question. Aren't all things relative? Isn't information more important than truth? Why? Why not? Is there such a thing as objective truth, and if there is, where can one go to get it?
2. Why is the time gap between actual events and the written record of them more significant than the elapsed time since the events themselves?
3. How does the historical record of Jesus' life compare with that of other significant historical figures? Why were more copies made of it than the writings of Caesar, Plato, Aristotle or Homer?
4. The Greek New Testament is the best attested book in ancient history. How do you respond to the suggestion that the Bible is flawed and therefore cannot be trusted as an accurate historical record? Why are critics so swift to condemn the accuracy of the Jesus story?



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
